2023 was the year with the highest number of ISDS claims ever registred

against LAC countries, with **28 claims**.



lawsuits until December 31, 2023 make LATIN AMERICA and THE CARIBBEAN the second most sued region in the world.

ARGENTINA, VENEZUELA, MEXICO, PERU and ECUADOR are the most sued countries in the region. Together, they were challenged by 244 lawsuits, representing almost 2/3 of all claims against LAC countries.



Governments have been ordered to pay foreign investors

\$ 33,629 billion.

This is a third more than the amount that climate catastrophes have cost the region between 1970 and 2021 and more than all the foreign direct investment received by the six Central American countries, the 15 Caribbean countries, Uruguay, Paraguay and Ecuador combined in 2022.



77,4% of all known claims against countries in LAC were filed at **ICSID**.



Only 30 ARBITRATORS (top 10%) were part of 44% of the arbitration tribunals in claims against LAC countries.

Lawsuits linked to MINING, GAS and OIL

account for 22,4% of total claims.
more than half of which were filed during the last decade.



In 60% of the cases resolved, the investor profited,

either obtaining a favourable award or benefiting from a settlement between the parties.

86% of the claims were initiated by investors from the US, Canada and Europe mainly France, The Netherlands, the United Kingdom and Spain.
